

PAKISTAN INTERNATIONAL SCHOOL STUDENT SETS A NEW RECORD BY SCORING 1014 MARKS IN FBISE SSC-II EXAMINATION 2017

AENA FAROOQ of Pakistan International School, Qatar (P.I.S.Q) set a new record ever made in Doha by securing 1014 marks out of 1050 marks in SSC-II Annual Examination 2017 of the Federal Board of Intermediate and Secondary Education (FBISE), Islamabad. She secured 1st position in all Doha-based Pakistani schools with 1014 marks by breaking the previous record of the school of 1010 marks last year.

This year too, Pakistan International School Doha, Qatar stood out by producing 100% results in SSC-II Examination wherein 21 students secured more than 900 marks. Out of 148 students, 37 students secured A1 grades (above 80 % marks), 36 students obtained A grades (above 70 % marks) and 49 students passed with B grades (above 60 % marks).

Aena Farooq grabbed 1st position with 1014 marks in the school as well as in Doha in the Science group. Amna Nasir stood 2nd with 974 marks while Syeda Aliza got 3rd position with 973 in the school in the Science group.

In Humanities, Kholoud secured 1st position by securing 872 marks, Maria secured 2nd position with 861 marks and Hajra Tariq stood 3rd by securing 817 marks.

She said that she is extremely excited that one of her students has once again set another new record in Doha.
